As strategic enablers, teachers drive student development and educational outcomes. Our ability to attract and retain exceptional teaching and support staff reflects the School's commitment to a clear educational philosophy, meaningful professional development, a collaborative work culture, and a strong focus on staff wellbeing.

In this plan, we deepen our commitment to building the inner man through the launch of the CCGS Institute and the expansion of our Health and Wellbeing program. The plan also includes expanding our international partnerships, increasing collaboration with girls' schools, and the delivery of major infrastructure projects including PERFORM, St John's Wood 2, and a new sports pavilion.

The School's healthy enrolment numbers are a strong endorsement of our reputation and the quality of education we provide from Pre-Kindergarten to Year 12. Interest in the School reflects the confidence families have with our academic standards, holistic approach and supportive community. 

3. Inspiring professionals


The Christ Church culture is defined by teachers and support staff who feel respected, valued and supported.
