<p><b>Year 11 and 12</b> Ms Clarke</p>	<p><b>Muresk – Agribusiness Degree Taster Course</b></p> <p>The School of Agribusiness at Muresk is providing Year 11 and 12 students with the opportunity to sample university life. The Agribusiness Degree Taster course provides information about the agriculture and agribusiness industries and gives students the opportunity to interact with current students and past graduates.</p> <p>The 'Agribusiness Degree Taster' is <b>on July 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup>, 2015</b>. The two-day event is held at the iconic Muresk Institute campus. There are limited places so students are encouraged to register as soon as possible. Those attending need to complete a registration form, signed by a parent or guardian by Monday <b>July 6</b>. There is a \$40 contribution toward catering and accommodation.</p> <p>The Student is responsible for arranging travel to and from the campus. There is a TransWA train and road coach service from East Perth and Midland to Northam. <p><b>Year 12 Exam Prep Courses</b> Ms Clarke</p>	<p><b>Murdoch University Intensive Exam Preparation Courses</b></p> <p>For the first time this year, <b>T.E.E. Consultants</b> will be conducting <u>intensive exam preparation courses</u> at Murdoch University. These intensive courses are based on the current WACE syllabus and are designed to improve student performances both at school and in the final tertiary examination.</p> <p>While emphasis will be on the course content, special attention will be paid to examination technique, methods of eliminating careless errors and how work should be presented to gain maximum marks. Students attending the course will also receive a workbook for each session.</p> <p>Programs will run from Monday 6<sup>th</sup> July to Friday 10<sup>th</sup> July 2015 and revision will cover the following subject areas:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>· Mathematics 2C/D</li> <li>· Mathematics 3A/B</li> <li>· Mathematics 3C/D</li> <li>· English</li> <li>· English Literature</li> <li>· Chemistry 3A/B</li> <li>· Physics 3A/B</li> <li>· Human Biology 3A/B</li> </ul> <p>Cost for each program is \$175 per subject area, which includes 2 hours per day, for 5 all five days (a total of 10 hours).</p>
