

Jeremy Ludlow (1983) was recently elected Chair of Council of the Peter Carnley Anglican Community School (PCACS). A school of the Anglican Schools Commission, PCACS is named after the Most Reverend Dr Peter Carnley AC, former Archbishop of Perth (1981 to 2005), former Primate of Australia (2000 to 2005), and father of Ben Carnley (1986). In 1985, Dr Carnley teamed up with former CCGS Headmaster Peter Moyes to establish the Anglican Schools Commission, which now operates 11 schools in WA, and three in the eastern states.

Professor John Newnham (1969)

continues his significant research into Women's and Infant health. His quest to address the prevention of pre-term birth has been reported in the AMA magazine and is considered a 'world first' initiative.

Geoffrey Thomas (1968)

is the Publisher and Editor in Chief of www.AirlineRatings.com the world's first airline safety rating website, Aviation Editor of The West Australian newspaper and Channel 7's Sunrise program as well as the Airlines Editor for Australian Aviation. Geoffrey also works extensively with CNN and the BBC covering air accidents. In the past 10 years Geoffrey has won 42 international and national awards for his works. Geoffrey has also co-written eleven books, the latest being The Plane Simple Truth and Greener Wings (third edition) on aviation's true affect on the environment, which has just been updated for the industry.

Entry into the Explorers Club was gained after participation in a number of expeditions in Australia and the SW Pacific, the most notable being the Australian Star Mountains Expedition in 1965 (being the last major area of Papua New Guinea to be explored by Europeans). This was a combination scientific/cave exploration/anthropological expedition which also conducted surveillance for the Australian Government along the border with Indonesia.
