RESCUE AND CHECK POINT DUTY

During the sailing season, Power boat owners are rostered to undertake rescue duties on competition days. During the Power boat season, Yacht owners and non-competing Power boat owners will be rostered to provide check points on competition days.

If you are unable to participate on your rostered day you must swap with another person on the roster list.

ACCESS TO CLUB PREMISES

The main gate key also provides access to the undercroft and toilets, whilst the ramp key is also the key for the ice vending machine. Both keys are available from the office

PARKING

Members are advised that parking is limited to Country, Senior or Family Members only. Only one car is permitted for each family. Dinghy Members have restricted parking on Sundays only.

Bays marked in red are for use by Bethesda Hospital Monday to Friday and we have use of their bays at the entrance over the weekend.

Regrettably the only way to protect the rights of members is to request the Council to impose fines to Offenders so would ask all members to respect the above rules.

RUBBISH

Bins are located near the slip winch housing for rubbish from boating activity. No rubbish is ever to be left in front of bin as pick up won't occur.

CONSTITUTION, RULES AND BY-LAWS

A copy of the Club Constitution, Rules and By-Laws are available for your perusal from the Office. A copy may be obtained upon request.

GOVERNANCE

The Club is managed by an elected General Committee that meets monthly. It is assisted by Sub-committees covering Sailing Competition, Power Competition, Pens and Moorings, Dinghy Competition and House

Members of the General Committee are listed on the back of this guide.

MEETINGS OF MEMBERS

An Annual General Meeting and a Half Yearly Meeting will be held each year. The office will advise all members of the dates—normally the third Thursday in September and March respectively.

Only Life, Special, Senior and Country members may vote at these meetings, however, all members are welcomed to attend

VISITORS

Each member is responsible for the conduct of their non-member visitors while on Club premises, which includes the jetty system.

Visitors cannot enter licensed premises of the Club unless they are accompanied by a member and have been signed into the Visitor's Book. Visitors who are participants in sporting events or Club functions do not have to be 'signed in'.

ACCOUNTS

All members' accounts are payable by the 21st day of the month after the month in which the charge was incurred. Members may pay their account by EFTPOS, Visa or MasterCard

SUBSCRIPTIONS

The annual membership subscription is billed on the 1st July each year. Subscriptions for senior 25+ memberships are billed in two annual moieties. Resignations must be in writing.

REDEEMABLE VOUCHERS

Each senior is charged \$100 for a quarterly issue of redeemable vouchers in July, October, January and April each year. The vouchers expire 6 months thereafter.

Once expired, vouchers are not redeemable.

Dinghy, Crew Members and Social members are charged \$75 half yearly. Vouchers are redeemable through the purchase of food & drink from the club and Club Regalia. They cannot be used to pay for subs, pen and storage fees or fuel.

ADDITIONAL CHARGES

The Club is a member of the Yachting Association of Western Australia. Your annual account indicates your contribution as a member to the cost of that affiliation. All Senior and Junior members are debited a trophy levy each year as a contribution towards trophy costs.

Senior members are asked whether they wish to make a donation (billed through their July account) to a Junior Sailing foundation and the Ron Tough Foundation.

MEALS

A la carte meals are available from the Club every Friday night for members and their guests. Every Wednesday night a buffet meal is available which is especially popular during the summer months after twilight sailing.

FUNCTION FACILITIES

The Club has a number of flexible function areas available for hire by members. These range from a ballroom, various carpeted areas and an enclosed balcony with panoramic river views. Catering can be undertaken from a fully equipped industrial kitchen run by our own in-house chef. An internal gas BBQ facility is also popular for informal functions. The facilities are ideal for social or business functions, training and seminars. Enquiries should be directed to the Office.

SAILING CLASSES

Informal sailing courses are conducted by trained staff using Club sailing dinghies and keelboats Details can be obtained from the Office.

TWILIGHT SAILING—WEDNESDAY EVENINGS DURING SUMMER

If you wish to enjoy a social sail, please contact the Office. The sailors welcome guests and power boat enthusiasts are encouraged to 'follow the fleet' around the buoys.

TIME TRIALLING

This takes place during the winter months on Saturday afternoons and is a perfect way to not only use your boats but to test your skills against the clock. Information sessions are held prior to the start of each season.

PENS AND MOORINGS

Refer to the Boating Accommodation Guide as well as the Rules and By-Laws of the Constitution governing conditions and use of Pens, Moorings and Hardstand Bays. Please ensure the appropriate forms are completed and returned to the office to affect any changes regarding your boat or pen status.

INSURANCE AND REGISTRATION PAPERS

Boats may only be penned at the Club or occupy hard standing if the Club possesses proof of current registration and a current third party liability policy for up to \$5,000,000. Members must provide copies of the processed renewal papers to the Office.

REFUELLING

The club provides petrol and diesel through bowsers at competitive prices. A fuel card is available from the office for a deposit of \$20 or a FOB key for a deposit of \$30 – a card or FOB is required to gain 24 hour access to the bowsers.

REFUELLING JETTY

The fuelling jetty is to be used for re-fuelling and related activity only, the time limit is one hour. A penalty of \$50 may be applied in the event of a member's vessel standing alongside the fuelling jetty for more than one hour without permission.
