About Shaun



Shaun Tan is an acclaimed artist and writer who grew up in Perth.

Subiaco Library has two impressive murals by Shaun Tan on display. *The Tea Party* features a riotous array of strange characters and landscapes and *The 100 Year Picnic* is based on a photograph from the 1920s found in the archives of the Subiaco Museum.

Shaun began drawing and painting images in small-press magazines as a teenager, and has since become best known for illustrated books that deal with social, political and historical subjects through surreal, dream-like imagery. He has won numerous awards for his unusual and thought-provoking books, including *The Red Tree, The Lost Thing, The Arrival* and *Tales from Outer Suburbia*. Shaun's books have been translated into many languages and are enjoyed by readers of all ages.

In 2011, Shaun won an Academy Award for his short film, *The Lost Thing*, and received the Astrid Lindgren Memorial Award honouring his contribution to international children's literature. Shaun has also worked as a concept artist for the films *Horton Hears a Who!* and Pixar's *WALL-E*. Some of Shaun's stories have been adapted for the stage and he is currently working on lots of exciting new projects.

Categories

Entries are judged individually in the following categories:

- A Lower primary years one and two
- **B** Middle primary years three and four
- C Upper primary years five and six
- **D** Lower secondary years seven, eight and nine
- **E** Upper secondary years ten, eleven and twelve

Prizes and exhibition

Finalists will receive an invitation by mail to the award presentation ceremony in June. Awards will be presented at the Subiaco Library, and best-placed category finalists who live and study outside the Perth metropolitan area will receive travel and accommodation assistance to attend the ceremony.

All best-placed finalists will receive prizes from the City of Subiaco and award sponsors and the first prize winner in each category will have their artwork framed. The top ten entries from each category will be

notified and exhibited at the Subiaco Library.
