4. PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I am very pleased to present the president's report to the AGM tonight.

The Don Fraser club was formed in 1986 and is named in honour of Don Fraser who was the inaugural head of rowing at CCGS. He was an accomplished oarsman winning 17 state titles in 17 years by the age of 34, a gold medal in the Empire Games in 1936 and was a member of the winning King's Cup crew in 1938. He was involved in rowing at CCGS from 1957 to 1974 and was a life member of the West Australian Rowing Club. He died in 2006 at the age of 91.

The Don Fraser Club together with three other parent groups are under the auspices of the Parents' Association which is the principal parent organisation at CCGS. The purpose of the Don Fraser Club is to support the rowing program at CCGS. In practical terms, this involves assisting with the house regatta, the travelling camps to Greenough and Augusta, the January camp including the breakfasts and barbecue, the head of the river dinner, pasta nights, the CCGS PSA regatta and regatta breakfasts. The DFC also facilitates communication between the Teacher in Charge of rowing and the parent body. The main social and fundraising event for the season is the annual Quiz night.

The DFC Committee is made up of 14 members. The meetings are mostly held every second Tuesday during the season and these were all very well attended this year. All rowing parents are welcome to attend these committee meetings.

The success of the DFC is due entirely to the work of parents and volunteers and I thank each and every person who has assisted in any way during the year. I'd particularly like to thank the members of the 2016/17 DFC committee.

I look forward to a fantastic time working with Justin as we build the program further, to continue and improve on the success the club has experienced in the past.

Term 1 2018 will prove to be very interesting with the club rowing out of Fremantle Rowing Club whilst the new walk down and ramp construction takes place.
