MEDIA STATEMENT: Christ Church teams dominate UNSW ProgComp

Christ Church Grammar School has once again dominated ProgComp with three of its teams placing in the top 10 of Australia.

An initiative of the University of New South Wales (UNSW) School of Computer Science and Engineering, ProgComp involves teams solving as many set programming tasks as possible with the use of coding languages such as python, C++, java and TypeScript.

Mr Jan Honnens, Teacher in Charge of Informatics at Christ Church said, "This year we had 14 teams compete in the Main Round of competition and at the conclusion of this round, three of our teams finished in the top 10 which is the best outcome we have ever achieved."

The School's Year 12 team comprising of Ben Davison-Petch, Marcus Handley and Nicholas Patrikeos finished in 3rd place, followed by Year 10s Angus Finch, Max Godfrey and Aditya Muthukattu in 4th place, and Year 9s Joshua Chen, Roman Green and Kenneth Lo in 9th place.

"This competition offers a fantastic opportunity for students to further their skills in thinking about and developing algorithms," said Mr Honnens.

"Two of our teams have now been selected to take part in the Grand Final which will be contested at UNSW this September."

"We are extremely proud of our boys and commend them on these outstanding achievements."

The UNSW ProgComp is the largest high school programming competition in Australia, with teams from every state and territory competing for prizes.
