

Christ Church makes it six in a row at PSA Swimming Inters

Christ Church Grammar School's swimming dominance continues.

Following a solid performance at last Tuesday's Public School's Association (PSA) Swimming Inters Carnival at HBF Stadium, the School secured yet another victory to retain the Tregonning Cup for the sixth year in a row.

The final results on the night had Christ Church in 1st place with 1041 points, followed by Hale (998), Scotch (828), Trinity (814), Wesley (660), Aquinas (627) and Guildford (307).

New records achieved by members of the School's swim squad included:

- Charlie Spencer setting a new time record of 28.01 (previous standing record 28.68 in 2021) in the U/14 50m Butterfly Division 1
- Jackson Anderson setting a new time record of 24.89 (previous standing record 25.26 in 2018) in the U/15 50m Freestyle Division 1
- Sam Hicks setting a new time record of 28.23 (previous standing record 28.98 in 2017) in the U/15 50m Backstroke Division 1
- Christ Church Grammar School (Max Ingham, Lawson Kirby, Ben MacGregor and Christian McGlew) setting a new time record of 1:55.02 (previous standing record 1:55.89 in 2019) in the U/14 200m (4 x 50m) Freestyle Relay Division 1

Christ Church Teacher in Charge of Aquatics, Mr Luke Farmer said the School's swim squad demonstrated great form, evident by the number of new PSA and school records achieved on the night.

"Our U/14 Freestyle Relay team comprised of Max Ingham, Lawson Kirby, Ben MacGregor and Christian McGlew were phenomenal, setting a new time record of 1:55.02 over the previous PSA record of 1.55.89," Mr Farmer said.

"We have a truly talented group of young swimmers at Christ Church Grammar School and we're proud to have watched all their hard work and commitment pay off on Tuesday," said Mr Farmer.
