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Education, training and careers

Great pastoral care for boarding students

BOARDING students have been an integral part of Christ Church Grammar School (CCGS) since 1910.

Located on the banks of the Swan River, students in years 7 to 12 enjoy being part of a tight-knit, diverse and inclusive residential community.

At CCGS, every boarding student receives exceptional pastoral care.

The staff of committed and qualified professionals are dedicated to supporting the holistic development of the boys in their care through an individualised and personal approach.

Health and wellbeing are a priority, with boarders receiving unrivalled care through the 'square of care'.

The square is comprised of the director of boarding, three year group co-ordinators – for years 7 and 8, years 9 and 10 and years 11 and 12 – a head of house and a tutor, supported by a 24-hour health centre team of professional nurses, who work closely to ensure each boy receives the support and encouragement he needs.

The year group co-ordinators live on campus with their families and are experienced academic staff members.

They support the performance and growth of each student in their care by developing a close and meaningful relationship with the boy and his parents, as well as maintaining close two-way communication with each boy's tutor and head of house.

They are the primary contact for parents and guardians for boarding issues.



At Christ Church Grammar School every boarding student receives exceptional pastoral care.

Housemothers play an important role in the lives of the boys.

They provide a maternal, guiding hand, taking care of the day-to-day management and many of the routines within the residential community.

Part of their role is to facilitate laundering and mending of clothes, organise the transport of boys to and from appointments and assist with travel reservations.

A key responsibility is accompanying young boarders to their medical appointments.

CCGS boarders enjoy meals cooked by an onsite team of professionals, ensuring students have access to nutritious and delicious meals that

can be customised to cater to individual dietary needs and preferences.

With a range of different bedroom configurations, the boys enjoy time with their housemates and form lifelong friendships.

Renovations on the Walters boarding house will finish in July, 2023, when all boys will be housed in a beautiful, contemporary facility.

The renovation includes airconditioning and painting throughout and new floors.

The new layout will include an upstairs area dedicated to years 7 and 8, including a recreation space/study nook.

On the ground level there will be another dedicated recreation space

for year 7s and bedrooms and amenities for year 12 students.

Field days in 2023

Every year, CCGS staff members attend multiple field days and host events across the State to meet with current boys and families interested in enrolling their boys at CCGS.

This year, staff will be attending the Karratha FeNaCING Festival, Dowerin Machinery Field Days and Esperance Agricultural Show – as well as visiting the South West and Wheatbelt regions.

On Board program for boarders

The On Board program is designed to assist year 6 students transitioning into the boarding community.

Relationships between the on board

team, boys and families are central to success of the program and transition.

Incoming students will receive a school-issued device to assist with the learning.

The program provides academic and pastoral support a year prior to boarding.

It involves meeting peers and staff in the boarding community and the director of boarding makes regular regional visits.

The transition from home to boarding school has been a part of the cycle of life for many remote and regional families for generations and every year CCGS also welcomes international students.

National Boarding Week

CCGS this week celebrates National Boarding Week, which is an opportunity for the school community to recognise the significant contribution its residential community makes to life at the school.

During this annual event, various activities are organised to celebrate and showcase the culture and community of the boarding school.

It is a time for current boarders, staff and alumni to get together and celebrate.

The event aims to promote the benefits of boarding, including the development of independence, leadership skills and a sense of community and belonging.
