Kings Park has drawn on the talents of English company Culture Creative for a new and ticketed event of light, colour and sound, called Lightscape, opening on Friday, June 16.

In a captivating 2km-long

walk, Lightscape will feature tree canopies illuminated in colour, a Winter Cathedral created by 100,000 tiny, twinkling illuminations, a Neon Night Garden with huge floral light sculptures, the treetop walk turned into a glowing tunnel, and birds, seeds and plants in giant projections.

Zoe Bottrell, managing director and project manager of Culture Creative, has been working on designing and installing Lightscape events in the UK, US and Europe for 17 years.

She has visited Australia several times in the past six months to program events in Sydney and Melbourne's Royal Botanic Gardens and Perth's Kings Park.

"Each event varies according to the conversation we want to have in that space and no two installations are the same. In Kings Park it will be inspired by seeds, pods and growth," Zoe said.
