Brian Leedman Chairman of BlinkLab Limited

Brian is a seasoned investor relations and capital raising professional in the healthcare sector, with prior senior marketing roles at Ernst & Young and Westpac. He spent a decade as VP of Investor Relations at ASX/Nasdaq-listed Sivida Corp and has since founded six ASX-listed healthcare companies, serving in leadership roles including Chairman and Director. One of these, ResApp Health, was acquired by Pfizer in 2022 for \$179 million. He currently chairs BlinkLab Limited (ASX:BB1), listed in April 2024. A former Chairman of AusBiotech (WA), he is also a guest lecturer at UWA, where he earned his BEcon and MBA.



Keegan Crage Founder and Chairman of On My Feet

Keegan launched his first business at 17, became a Chartered Accountant at KPMG, led an international ASX-listed equipment rental group as CEO, and now owns a national IT services firm. He holds four postgraduate qualifications, has studied at Oxford and Harvard, and is currently completing a Master of Cyber Security at Oxford. A two-time triathlon World Championships representative for Australia, he founded On My Feet in 2014, a nonprofit helping people at risk of homelessness through running. In 2024, he published Homeless and Hopeful, sharing powerful stories of transformation from those who've rebuilt their lives through the program.


Andrew Sugiaputra Managing Director of Golden Group
