## Pathways to my educational goals

Before you begin to think about Year 11 subjects, you should try to decide what educational level you want to reach before you enter the work force and what further study options are required for that area.

### ATAR pathway

If you are contemplating further study at a university after Year 12, you should consider the ATAR pathway.

You will need to make up a subject program over Year 11 and 12 that meets the requirements for tertiary entry and includes subjects that are prerequisites for the university courses you might be considering.

Below, list the university courses you presently feel you might be interested in and the prerequisite subjects you must do to get into them. The University Admission 2027 booklet from TISC (<u>https://tisc.edu.au/static-fixed/guide/slar-2027.pdf</u>) will give you information about prerequisites at all four public universities.

### Non-ATAR pathway

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If you are considering undertaking a certificate or diploma course through a TAFE college, or going directly into employment, you should consider the non-ATAR pathway.

These courses do not require a Tertiary Admission Ranking for admission but often require completion of Year 12. These courses can also be used as an alternative pathway to university.

## Subject options - ATAR pathway

For students seeking to receive an ATAR at the end of Year 12, six subjects must be chosen from these lists:

- One English subject (English or Literature or EAL/D) from List A.
- At least one subject from List B.
- Four more subjects from List A and/or List B.
- One to two subjects may be chosen from the non-ATAR options, marked with an asterisk (\*).

Some subjects may be run at MLC and some may have MLC girls enrolled. Parents and students will be advised later in the year if a selected subject is to run at MLC.

To prepare for your interview, **highlight the subjects you are considering, and cross out the subjects that do not interest you**. This will provide a starting point for discussions.

## Subject options – non-ATAR pathway

Students on a non-ATAR pathway will be studying 0-3 ATAR courses.

Students who undertake this pathway are required to undertake a course in English, Mathematics, Careers & Employability and a work placement or certificate course. In most cases students will study English General and Mathematics Essential General, however, if students have not met the OLNA requirements for literacy and numeracy by the end of Year 10 they are advised to consider the Foundation course in Year 11. Students also choose an additional three subjects for study.

Some subjects may be run at MLC and some may have MLC girls enrolled. Parents and students will beadvised later in the year if a selected subject is to run at MLC.

In Year 12, students continue to study 6 subjects, selecting an additional subject to replace Careers & Employability which is not offered at the Year 12 level.

All students completing a non-ATAR pathway are encouraged to consider the completion of a certificate course. Further certificate courses will be available in Year 12 for students studying no more than one ATAR subjects.

To prepare for your interview, highlight the subjects you are most considering and cross out the subjects which you are not interested in. This will provide a starting point for discussions.
