Gary Johnson

Gary began his electrical apprenticeship at 17 and quickly progressed, mentoring others by his second year. Seeking greater opportunity, he relocated to the remote town of Fitzroy Crossing, where he founded Alcolizer Technology in 1990 - starting with a wall-mounted breathalyzer built in a garage. Over time, Alcolizer grew into a global leader in alcohol and drug testing, widely recognised for its innovation. In 1998, he co-founded the Kimberley Regional Service Provider (KRSP) in partnership with the Marra Worra Worra Aboriginal Corporation. KRSP went on to deliver essential services, infrastructure maintenance, and community projects, significantly improving the lives of Indigenous people across Western Australia's Kimberley region.



Michael Veletta

Michael Veletta, one of Western Australia's finest opening batsmen, broke tradition early by switching from soccer to cricket, quickly excelling as a batsman, fielder, and wicketkeeper. Debuting for WA at 19 alongside legends like Lillee and Marsh, he went on to represent Australia in both Test and One Day formats, with highlights including the 1986 tour of India. After retiring at 31, he moved into coaching before launching a successful real estate career, eventually becoming a senior leader at CBRE. Elected to the WACA Board in 2016 and inducted into the WA Cricket Gallery of Greats in 2025, Veletta's journey reflects a life of excellence in sport, business, and community.
