



1. **Venue**

Barrack Street Jetty (M.V. James Stirling) 6.30pm to 9.00pm. Students should arrive punctually at 6.15pm to board the vessel and be collected promptly at 9.00pm.

2. CCGS students will need to produce their ticket to gain entry to the boat.

Staff from participating schools will monitor the entry of their respective students boarding the boat and provided it is not raining, will meet and check students before boarding the boat under the supervision of school staff.

3. **Dress**

This is an informal social for students to be attractively dressed, without going to any great expense.

4. **Requirements**

Smoking, vaping and the use of alcohol and/or illegal drugs are not permitted and the usual school rules and requirements apply. Anyone who does not comply with these requirements, parents will be contacted by phone and the respective schools will be responsible for appropriate disciplinary actions.

5. Supervision at the social will be by staff from all CCGS and St Hildas.

6. Student behaviour is expected to be exemplary at all times with the appropriate manners and respect shown to supervising staff and boat staff, as well as the girls who are guests at this event.

7. Any student who may require the use of an EpiPen/Anaphylactic kit or Diabetes hypo kit must have this on their person and alert a staff member of this prior to boarding the vessel.

8. Bags are not allowed on board, and no money is required for the evening. Responsible use of mobile phones is expected at all times (not seen, not heard). Unlimited water and a light supper of pizza and Krispy Crème donuts will be supplied.

9. It is the responsibility of parents to ensure that transport arrangements for their son or daughter to and from the river cruise are satisfactory. Walking to and from the venue and taxi transportation is not appropriate.
