POSITION CONTEXT:

Christ Church Grammar School is an Anglican day and boarding school for boys from Pre-Kindergarten to Year 12. Located in Perth, Western Australia, the School overlooks the Swan River at Freshwater Bay in Claremont. Enrolments are comprehensive and at present are approximately 1850 students including boarders.

This 6-month maternity leave contract is responsible for delivering ATAR Media Production and Analysis and Lower School Design programs, creating engaging and contemporary learning experiences that inspire creativity, critical thinking and student achievement. The role contributes to curriculum planning, assessment and the broader life of the School, with the ability to teach Photography highly desirable and considered a valuable enhancement to the School's Media and Design offerings.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Deliver engaging and high-quality teaching and learning programs in Media and Design, aligned with the School's curriculum and educational objectives.
- Teach ATAR Media Production and Analysis, delivering contemporary, industry-relevant learning experiences and supporting strong student outcomes.
- Teach Photography courses, with demonstrated experience in digital photography highly desirable.
- Incorporate current media, design and digital technologies, practices and emerging trends into teaching and learning programs.
- Plan, develop, implement and review curriculum programs and assessments across Media and Design subjects as required.
- Employ contemporary and inclusive pedagogical practices that support diverse learning needs, promote student engagement and encourage academic excellence.
- Foster a positive, creative and student-centred learning environment that encourages innovation, collaboration, critical thinking and self-expression.
- Contribute positively and collaboratively to the ongoing development of curriculum, co-curricular programs and departmental initiatives.
- Contribute to the co-curricular life of the School through involvement in exhibitions, showcases, competitions, productions and other media and design-related activities.

EXPERIENCE AND QUALIFICATIONS

This position requires:

- Relevant tertiary qualifications and experience related to the teaching of Art, with ATAR Media essential and Photography experience highly desirable
- All applicants to be eligible to teach in Western Australia, have National Police Clearance and have completed a Working with Children Check

The person must:

- Demonstrate exceptional interpersonal and communication skills, with the ability to build positive and professional relationships with students, parents and colleagues from diverse backgrounds.
- Deliver engaging, high-quality teaching and learning programs that reflect contemporary educational practice and the learning needs of boys.
- Inspire students to value learning, set meaningful goals and strive to achieve their personal best.
- Demonstrate the ability to differentiate teaching and learning strategies to support a diverse range of student abilities, interests and needs.
- Foster a positive, inclusive and student-centred learning environment that encourages collaboration, critical thinking and active participation.
- Effectively assess, monitor and report on student progress and curriculum outcomes.
- Work collaboratively within a team environment, contributing positively to curriculum development, assessment practices and the sharing of professional expertise.
- Demonstrate excellent organisational, planning and time-management skills, with the ability to prioritise competing demands, manage multiple tasks and consistently meet deadlines.
- Utilise educational technologies effectively and demonstrate proficiency in the use and management of ICT resources.
- Uphold the values and ethos of the School through professionalism, integrity, initiative, adaptability and a commitment to ongoing professional learning.

CO-CURRICULAR:

All Teachers are involved in some co-curricular activity commensurate and prorated according to their contract teaching load, and as a consequence, join other Teachers and possibly other members of the school community in activities which will embrace associated professional obligations e.g., collegial support and administrative meetings.
